

Annual general Meeting of Horticultural
Society held in Library of Hall

23rd March 1921

Chair

Minutes of Previous Meeting
were read and confirmed.

The Treasurer submitted the
Financial statement for the past year
which showed a total income of
£33-13. and an expenditure of £20-15-6.
leaving a balance on Deposit Receipt of
£12-17-6 which was considered
satisfactory and passed

The Office Bearers for the year

were all collected, Messrs Greenson,
Sheils. & Learmonth being added
to the Committee. The Prize List
was revised and the following
additions & alterations made.

The competition for 3 stalks Rhubarb
to be for Equality only. In collection of
Vegetables, 6 varieties. the first-prize was
increased from 3/- to 5/-. The Prize for
one Hydrangea was dropped, and
four spikes Stocks introduced instead
of four Stocks, and the competition
for four Herbaceous Spikes to be for
four different varieties. and one for
four Spikes Phloxes different varieties
added. Class. 6. Beanes. was changed
to industrial section and Competitions
added for. Best pair Hand knitted
Ladies Stockings. and Best pair
Hand knitted Gent's Socks.

Best exhibit made by Lady or Gent
Value 2/6. Best specimen of hand-
-writing by Boy or Girl attending
Gifford or Longyester Schools two Prizes
(one for each) to be given by A. B.
Macdonald Esqr Holybank. It was
agreed that no Competitor could have
more than one entry in each competition
in the various classes, and that all
Competitors must be Members of the
Society except - in No 4. 5. 6. 7 in class 3
and No 7. 8. in class 6. It was further
agreed to continue the yearly subscription
at 1/- as before and to drop the 1/- entry
money in the Butter Competition.

On the motion of the Chairman
Mr. Macdonald. seconded by Mr. Johnston
the following rule was proposed

"All entries for Competition to be made
to the Secretary one week previous

to the Show and thereafter Gardens
of Competitors in Fruit. Flowers. and
Vegetables. to be open for inspection by
the Secretary and Members of Committee
up to date of Show" Mr. Macnaughton
seconded by Mr. Greirson moved the
Previous Question but on a vote
being taken the Chairmans motion
was carried by 10 votes to 5. The Secretary
was instructed to write members whose
annual Subscription remain unpaid
drawing their attention to this before
the Printed List for the year was
made up.

reserve. the two former to act in the
Garden Competition. Mr MacLeod
undertook to arrange for an exhibition
table of Flowers from Jester Gardens for the
Show. The following Members
agreed to undertake the various

Duties as attending Members on
The Day of the Show. Mr. MacNaughton
Mr. Bell. Mr. Brown. Mr. Kenlop Mr. Shields
Mr. Guirson Mr. Young & Mr. Wilson.

It was decided to hold the
usual dance on the evening of the Show
the Charge for a mission to be 1/-
for Ladies & 1/6 for Gentlemen
Mr. Logan to be asked to supply
the Music for same at a Fee of 30/-
for three Musicians & Mr. Young
to act as M. d. Mr. MacNaughton
raised the Question of appointing
Members of Com. to inspect the
Gardens of Competitors as per the
latter half of Rule five but none of
the Members would undertake this
body and the matter dropped.
