

The Annual Meeting of the Society was held in the Public Hall on Tuesday evening, 17th. March, 1914.

A. D. Macdonald Esq. President in the Chair. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

The Secretary's Report, showing a Balance of £6. 2. 6 in favour of the Society was read and approved.

The Election of Officers was then proceeded with:

-Mr. J. Main, having declined the Presidency, Mr. Macdonald was re-elected for 1914.

Mr. Robt. Wilson was elected Vice-President and Committee as last year, with the addition of Mr. J. Main.

In considering the Prize Schedule, the class for 24 Black Currants was struck out. In class 4 varieties of Sweet peas it was proposed & carried that 5/-; 2/-; 9^d be prize money.

Mr. Brown proposed, & Mr. Douglas seconded that Window boxes should be limited in length to not more than 3 ft.

Mr. Main moved, & Mr. Campbell seconded that boxes remain as before.

Motion carried by 7 to 3.

Mr. McKelvie proposed & Mr. Hunter seconded that boxes be brought to Show to judge.

Mr. Main proposed and Mr. Brown seconded that boxes be judged in windows as heretofore. Motion carried by 9 to 6.

It was proposed, seconded, & unanimously carried that class for 12 Sections of Honey be divided into 2 classes viz: 6 sections Flower Honey, 6 sections Heather Honey, prizes of original class to be divided.
