Sir Peter Reid in the Chair
- Flower Vases The 4 doz Polythene 2 piece vases now received, and although not entirely to everybody's satisfaction, were being retained and would be used for light weight types of exhibits.
- Raffle Books Members were asked to return all books as soon as possible.
- Flower Show Mr Mather Convener gave a report on the arrangements for the Dance. Jand. Manhattan Quartette, homemade & crisps, for sale. Tickets 4/- each from 8 p- to 11.30. An advertisement was being inserted in the Courier by the Dance Committee. It was proposed to hold a "Rose Queen" competition during the dance, and Sir Peter Reid agreed to judge the competition.
- Tea at Show The final advertisement in the Courier would mention "Tea & Biscuits" instead of Tea available. Mr Hogg had notices made for display in the Marquee advertising Tea & Biscuits 1/- per head in Village Hall. All were requested to provide biscuits for this venture.
- Staging for Flower Show Mr Jennings and assistants had prepared the staging for on top of the tables for the flower section. Mr Gowan had purchased an additional quantity of black Polythene, for covering the new staging. Mr Pearson (Joiner) had gifted the platform made last year to the Society, and the members were arranging to erect it, and decorate it with plants for the show.
- Lunches Mr Hogg agreed to accompany the judges along with Miss McNaughton, as Mr Hamilton would not now be available.
- Advertisement in Scotsman As nothing had been done regarding advertisement in Scotsman it was agreed to cancel the idea for this year.

- Sales Table Donations to this stall were required, and all members present were asked to spread the word around to as many people as possible.
- Auction of gifted exhibits As Mr Arch. Campbell would not be available this year Mr Mather agreed to auction the goods at the end of the show.
- Water for exhibits Mr Hardie had arrangements on hand to provide chains of water outside the tent for the use of exhibitors.
- Lighting Mr Jennings would make arrangements to have electric light led to the Marquee.
- Night Watchman Mr Hardie agreed to approach Jack Calme to do this duty at the same figure of £1.10/- as last year. If Mr Calme was not available he volunteered to do the job himself.
- Tent Door. It was mentioned that last year the door of the Marquee was in the middle and proved unsuitable. The male members who would be present on the Friday when the Marquee was erected agreed to try and arrange for a more suitable siting of the door.
- Stewards To accompany the judges were arranged as follows.
Flowers & Vegetables - Mr Jennings, Hogg, & Grindlay
Children, Industrial, Floral Art - Mr Gowan, Miss McNaughton and Miss Weddell.
- Doorkeepers To take the entrance money were arranged as follows.
1 p- to 2 p- Mr Mather
2 p- to 3 p- Mr Grindlay & Mr Hardie
3 p- to 4 p- Mr Jennings & Mr Hogg
4 p- to 5 p- Mr Mather & Mr Hardie
5 p- to 6 p- jointly by above named.
- Presentation Boquet It was agreed that this year a boquet for the Countess of Haddington should be purchased from Robb of Henneclaw at £1 to £1.10/- Mr Gowan agreed to arrange for this.
- Dahlia Competition It was agreed that there should be a similar competition to last year. Mr Jennings would provide vases of Dahlias, Mr Mather would get the entrance tickets printed, Miss Weddell would sell the tickets at the Sales Table. Sir Peter would receive

the results from the judges, and hold it until the competition closed.

It was agreed that the Raffle should take place about 5.30 p.m. approx. To be followed by the results of the Jubilee Competition then the Auction of Gifted Exhibits.

Prizes for Raffle.

It was intimated that Committee Members should bring any prizes to the tent for display on the Sales Table.

Mrs Armstrong

The Secretary intimated that a bouquet of flowers had been sent to Mrs Armstrong when she was in hospital undergoing an operation, and that a reply had been received thanking the Committee for their action.

In view of Mrs Armstrong's indisposition, Mr Harrison, Mrs Hamilton and Mr Murray would organize the acceptance of the entry forms, and Mr Harrison, Mr Dalgate and Mr George Murray would compile the prize winners lists and pay out the prize money.

Minutes

The minutes of previous meeting held on 13th August which
dealt solely with arrangements for the Flower Show were
taken as read and approved.

Correspondence

A letter from R.C.H.S. was read dealing with their Autumn
Exhibition in Waverley Market, Edinburgh on 24th & 25th Sept 1969.
Tickets were available for the show and Members were invited
to purchase same at 2/- each.

Flower Show

Sir Peter Reid opened the discussion on the Show by expressing
his pleasure at the success of the show, and thanked all members
of Committee for their efforts. Mrs. Armstrong was then asked
for a financial report. She intimated that the final results
should be good, but could not give any definite figures, as
many accounts were still to be rendered.

The Meeting was then thrown open for general discussion
from which the following points were put forward for
decisions at a future meeting.

Marquee

Space was limited, and the prices of larger Marquees should be obtained.
An alternative suggestion was use of Hall for part of the show.

Classes

Before compiling next years schedule, a study of this years entries
should be made to ensure unpopular classes were excluded.

Days Section

Should be extended to include additional classes

2 Day Show

There was suggestions for a 2 day show, The Secretary to obtain
costs to enable further discussions to take place.

Marquee Entrance

It was stressed that for future shows the entrance to the Marquee
should be at the far end.

Federal Art

Classes

Sections should be adjusted for a future year, and some classes
should be made open. The Federal Art and Industrial Sections
should be divorced from each other.

Federal Art Sections

It was unanimously agreed that the Federal Art Sections
bought for this year had been a failure, and that some other means
of providing alternatives be devised. Mrs. Mather had seen another
type and was going to make enquiries regarding the possibility of
purchasing a similar type.

Staging

The staging for the Flower Sections had been most successful
and it was suggested that staging for some of the Industrial classes
would be an advantage. The classes for Pot Plants would
require more suitable staging in other years.

Trade Entry

If show space was going to be limited, it was suggested to do
away with the "Trade Stand" as it did not serve a very great
purpose at the Show.

Show Plan

It was stressed that a drawn plan should be made before the
erection of the Marquee, in order that the layout of tables etc.
can be accomplished more easily, and staging tickets placed.
There should also be a plan for workers to save everybody's time
and effort.

Judges

It was advocated that all judges should be changed at
regular intervals if not yearly.

Late Entries

Should not be accepted, especially if it involved changes in
the lay out of the ~~changes~~ staging plans.

Vases

It was stated by members that 2 boxes of 10 vases belonging to
Giffard appeared to be held by Haddington. Sir Peter Reid
said he would make enquiries.

Teas

It was agreed that the Teas had been most successful and should
be continued in future years.

Raffle Tickets

An additional quantity should be purchased for next year.

Dance

The Dance had been a success, but it was suggested that for future
years should take place prior to the show day on a Friday night.

Spring Show

A suggestion was made to run a spring show in addition to
the summer show, but owing to the time factor it was agreed

that for next year all we could attempt would be a Coffee Evening with a Garden lecture, with a show of bulbs in bowls on the same evening.

Winter activities

In addition to the above it was hoped that other activities might be organised for the winter months, with a possible outing sometime during the year.

A fair attendance of members with Sir Peter Reid in the chair of last Annual General Meeting were read and approved were received from MRS G. R. Brown, MRS J. Hogg & Miss K. Judges
